

It has been an interesting fall in TLDSB as our enrolment in some schools exceeded the expectations. This meant that some schools were adding classrooms in September. Toys at School

We have had an increase in the number of toys coming to school. We see a wide range of small toys such as Shopkins, Littlest Pet Shop, Lego, Trucks, Cars and Pokeman Cards to name just a few. While we appreciate that the children love to have these at school, the staff have experienced a great deal of conflict between students and many, many tears as the items are lost or there are trades that are regretted. This often impacts instructional time as teachers work through the conflicts. We are asking that parents support our request that the children not bring these small toys to school.

School Start/End Times

Our entry bell rings at 8:45 and our final bell rings at 3:10. We ask that you help us to protect the instructional time by leaving your child here for the entire day. When students arrive late or are picked up early, the learning in the classroom is interrupted. We realize that there are times when pick up during the day cannot be avoided (appointments, illness) however we hope to minimize these times. Please note that when you call the school office with last minute changes to pick up, it is often difficult to get the message to your child due to class schedules. Putting a note in the agenda in the morning will ensure that we can have your child in the right place at the right time!
