Message from the Principal

Whether you are well acquainted with DGH already or if this is your first experience with our school, please be aware that DGH provides a wide range of activities over the course of the school year. September and early October will see a number of important events taking place. Information on each of these events follows in the newsletter in more detail. Please remember to post the safe arrival number by your phone so you can call and leave a message should your child(ren) be absent. When a student is absent and the school has not been informed, office staff go to great lengths to determine if the student is safe. A short message on the Safe Arrival Line helps eliminate this issue.

Supervision on the yard does not begin until 8:40 a.m.. Students should not be arriving prior to 8:40 a.m. (as we cannot ensure safety without staff being on duty).

VOLUNTEERS

As always, we depend on parent volunteers to assist with a variety of tasks in the school. If you are interested in supporting programs or assisting with supervision on field trips by

volunteering your time, please complete the volunteer form.

All volunteers are required to have a current criminal reference check on file with the school. Forms for the criminal reference check are available in the school office. If you have a police check on file at the school that was completed last year, you will only need to sign an offence declaration.

This year we would like you to consider volunteering for Head Checks which is a very important part of our volunteer program.

DROPPING OFF AND PICKING UP STUDENTS

Parents dropping off students are reminded that students and parents are to use the crosswalk at the middle of the bus loading area to cross from the parking lot to the school.

Parents dropping off Kindergarten students in the morning or picking up Kindergarten students in the afternoon are asked to remain outside the fenced area. This allows our staff to monitor the students very closely. Please respect that we need these restrictions in order to ensure everyone's safety.

Parents meeting students at the end of the day are asked to meet the students in the main entrance foyer. This ensures student safety.

Parents picking up students during the day are asked to report to the office and sign them out. The secretaries will call students from class and the students will meet their parents in the office.

Parents, please note that if your plans change in the afternoon and you have to get a message about transportation to your child, please be sure to call by 2:15 p.m. at the latest. This will help us ensure that your son/daughter receives the appropriate message.

THE LUNCHMILK PROGRAMS

The Milk program will begin for the last 2 weeks of September. The price of milk will remain the same as last year - 0.75 cents per carton. Money for this important program will once again be collected monthly. Milk order forms will go home the second week of school. Our Lunch Program (pizza, subs and pitas) will begin in October. Lunch order forms go home later in September.



NUTRITION BREAKS

Students who live outside the school's walking area or who are participating in a nutrition break activity, usually stay for the break. They eat in their own classroom under staff supervision for the first twenty minutes of the break.

Students who live in Little Britain may choose to go home for the second nutrition break.

Parents are asked to please send a note to the classroom teacher to indicate the normal procedure for that break (e.g., home for the break every day or at school for the break every day). Exceptions to the normal routine must be communicated to the classroom teacher or the school office by written note or phone.

Students leaving school property during the second nutrition break on an occasional basis must have a dated, signed note for each occasion. They must sign out as they leave and sign in while returning.

Students who leave the property for the second nutrition break may not return until twenty minutes into the nutrition break when supervision of the playground begins. Any food or drinks bought in Little Britain must be consumed before returning to the school property.

Students are not allowed to buy candy etc. and bring it back to school. Students must have their nutrition break and return directly to school.

They should not be in other areas of the village such as the Community Centre, ball diamond or forest areas. Students should not be visiting homes other than their own.

All School Code of Conduct rules are in effect while students are downtown.

Students in Grades 6, 7 and 8 will not be permitted to leave the school grounds on dance days.

LOCKERS

Students in Grades 4-8 will be assigned individual lockers. Students are to bring their own lock; however, they must provide their homeroom teacher with the combination. In the event that we have a problem with a lock brought from home, we may have to cut the lock to open it. Please be aware that should a lock be cut (e.g., because we suspect there may be something inappropriate in a locker) the school will not cover the cost of the lock.

Lockers are school property and as such may be opened by school personnel at any time. Use of a secure locker may be denied if proper care is not being demonstrated.

Meet the Staff Night – Thursday, September 25th

Keep Wednesday, September 25th, from 5:30 - 7:00 p.m., open for DGH's annual Meet the Staff night! **On this night, staff will be in their classrooms from 5:30**



p.m. to 6:00 p.m. and will then be in the gym for pizza and "chit chat" until 7:00 p.m..

Please remember that the intent of this night is for parents and guardians to briefly meet with their child's homeroom staff. The intent is not for this to be an in-depth meeting regarding student progress to this point. Should a parent/guardian seek more in-depth information, please schedule a separate meeting with your child's teacher.

Like last year, parents will be able to order in advance pizza which will be available in the gym from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m..

This is your best opportunity at the beginning of the year to meet the staff in your child's classroom! The opportunity for parents to meet staff and vice versa is a critical one in the school year. I hope that the majority of our parents and guardians will be able to attend.

Scholastic Book Fair – September 24th to 26th

September is here and our students are back into their books! Let's start the year off on the right foot with a new and exciting book from the DGH Book Fair. DGH has timed the Book Fair so that it is here during the Meet the Staff Night. The Book Fair is a wonderful opportunity for children to experience and share in the joy of reading while adding new resource materials to our school's library. The book fair will be open for students on Wednesday, September 25th through to Friday, September 26th. It will be open on Thursday, September 26th from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. during our Open House. Come out, meet your child's new teacher, and help encourage the love of reading with a cool new book!

Hepatitis B and HPV Shots – Thursday, October 30th

The Health Unit will be here on Thursday, October 30th to provide the Grade 7 students with their first stage of the Hepatitis B shot. Grade 8 girls will be provided with the HPV needle. Watch for the paperwork that comes home with permission forms for these needles. Students must have completed paperwork in order to receive these needles.

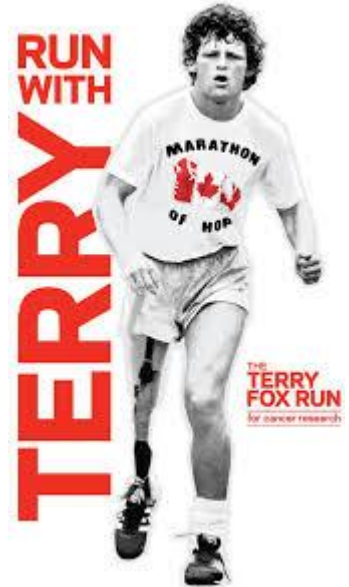
DGH's Terry Fox Run – Friday, September 26th

Nutrition News – Mrs. De Groot

I hope everyone had a safe and healthy summer. Now we are back to routines and busy lives.

It has been documented that breakfast is the most important meal of the day. Below are some tips I have found online that might encourage your children to eat breakfast.

Ideas for Back to School Breakfasts

Perhaps your child will be tempted to eat these delicious choices:

- Make a parfait. Layer low fat yogurt with berries and top with granola.
- Pair whole-grain cereals, containing ≥ 5 grams of fiber and ≤ 10 grams of sugar, with low fat or fat free milk. Top with fresh or dried fruit.
- Have a special breakfast once a week featuring smoothies, pancakes, waffles, or omelets.
- For smoothies, blend low fat milk with frozen berries and a banana (or any fruit) and blend for 30 seconds.
- Serve unusual breakfast foods once in a while like last night's leftovers.
- Opt for a whole fruit instead of fruit juice (but always choose 100% fruit juice when splurging).

For those children who need a top up later in the morning, our school offers a breakfast program. It is a "grab and go" version, in which students select some food from trays set up in three locations in the school. The trays are stocked with foods from the four food groups. This program will begin, hopefully, on September 15.

Due to an overwhelming positive response by parents and students of DGH to last year's breakdance session, we are very excited to announce that "Jimmy Chapman" is coming to Dr. George Hall once again! Students from Kindergarten to Grade 8 will have an opportunity to learn cool new "breakdancing moves" in a fun and inclusive setting. Jimmy will be visiting our school every Tuesday for six weeks starting September 16th. This initiative supports the dance and fundamental movement components of the Physical Education Program. Each class will participate in three breakdance sessions. Primary classes will begin dancing on September 16th, with subsequent sessions on September 23rd and 30th. Junior and Intermediate classes will begin their breakdancing on October 7th, followed by sessions on October 14th and 21st. New moves and skills will be introduced each week. All students will be participating in this initiative as part of their regular gym time.

Lockdown" Practices

DGH students will be involved in a number of "Lockdown" (Code Red) Practices throughout the year. In a Lockdown Practice, students find a safe location in which to stay while the Lockdown has been announced. Lockdown announcements are usually announced over the school's PA system. A typical Lockdown announcement would be "Staff and students we have a Lockdown situation."

This normally involves students:

- remaining in his/her classroom, shutting and locking the classroom door, remaining silent and out of sight of any windows
- should a student not be able to get into his/her classroom he/she would find the safest location possible (e.g., another classroom, a bathroom stall) and remain as silent as possible.

A Lockdown might be announced if there was a danger in the school or local area.

The goal in practicing Lockdowns is that students know exactly what to do should a Lockdown be announced. Should your child come home and have questions or concerns regarding Lockdown practises (or his/her involvement in one) please discuss this with him/her and always feel free to contact the school if you require further information.

Hold and Secure Practices

A second possibility that parents should be aware of is that of a "Hold and Secure" being announced. A Hold and Secure might be announced if there was a less serious danger in the school/local area (e.g., a bear was seen close to the school or the police had alerted the school as to something taking place close to the school). A typical Hold and Secure Announcement would be "Staff and students we have a Hold and Secure situation." If

students were OUTSIDE (e.g., during recess) the school's bells would be rung several times and students are expected to immediately return to their classrooms.

This normally involves students:

- remaining in his/her classroom (e.g., not leaving to use the washroom or get a drink) until the "All Clear" announcement is made
- returning to his/her classroom if they were out of it for some reason (e.g., getting a drink)
- immediately leaving the yard (if they are at recess) and returning to his/her classroom

The purpose of this information is not to be alarmist, but rather to have students and staff practise this so that if it should ever have to be called that the response is one of routine and calm.

Severe Weather Alerts

Should severe weather be expected or seen at the school (e.g., thunderstorms and lightning or a tornado) and students are out at recess - the signal to indicate that they are to enter the school and go to his/her classroom will be the bell being rung off and on several times. This is the same signal as a Hold and Secure.

Nut and Peanut Safe School

DGH endeavours to be a "Peanut Safe School." We encourage all parents to NOT send food containing peanut, peanut products, or tree nuts (almonds, Brazil nuts, etc...) to school.



Should a student mistakenly/accidentally bring a food item to school that contains or has come into contact with nuts, they will be asked to place the item back in their lunch bag. Should the student absolutely need to eat that food item, they may do so in the office.

Should you have any questions regarding our Peanut and Tree Nut Safe School Policy feel free to contact the office.

Police Checks and Vulnerable Sector Checks and Volunteers at the School

Please be aware that the format for Police Checks and Vulnerable Sector checks have changed in the past few months. It can take several weeks for these checks to be completed and returned to the applicant.

Police Checks continue to be processed in the manner they have been previously. However, volunteers now must also have a Vulnerable Sector search completed. A volunteer would typically have the Police Check and Vulnerable Sector search completed at the same time. We have heard that the Vulnerable Sector search can take several weeks to process, so if you are interested in volunteering in the school (e.g., in classrooms, for class trips, the snack program) you will need to have both checks completed.

Volunteers at the school must have both the Police Check and the Vulnerable Sector search done. The form for the Vulnerable Sector search can be obtained from the school and requires the school to fill out certain sections before taking to the OPP.

Please be aware that DGH will be following a strict "NO POLICE CHECK - NO VOLUNTEERING AT THE SCHOOL OR FOR CLASS TRIPS THIS YEAR." If you think that you may volunteer at DGH in any way this year, you MUST have an original and updated police and vulnerable check completed and on file at the office.

VALUABLES AND ELECTRONICS

A reminder that students are NOT to bring valuables (money, jewellery & expensive sports equipment) or electronic devices such as cell

phones, iPods, MP3 players etc. to school. We cannot be responsible for the loss of any of these articles.

Individual staff members **may** give permission for certain electronics to be used in the classroom (e.g., an iPod). Students (and parents) should be aware that:

- this permission may be revoked (on an individual or class basis)
- this permission applies during specific class times and may not be applicable during nutrition break or indoor recesses
- these electronics should not be taken outside of the classroom (e.g., because you are permitted to use an iPod in class does not mean that you can take it outside onto the yard)
- the school cannot be held responsible for damaged or lost items
