Volunteers

This is a serious safety issue for us and we thank you for your attention to this matter.

We know that they can be a valuable educational tool and as a responsive staff, we are committed to providing explicit instruction to students on the appropriate use of this device within the school system. Over the course of the next days and weeks, there will be classroom discussions and instruction on how to maximize this piece of technology in classroom cultures where it is appropriate. We recognize that many families also choose not to provide their child with a cell phone alternative technological devices will allow them access to the same instruction.
