Safety and Security at Lady Eaton

The safety of our students is a priority at Lady Eaton.

ON THE YARD

The supervision of students at Lady Eaton begins each day at 8:35 a.m. Students are **not** supervised before this time and should **not** be left alone on school property or dropped off at the office. Once the bell rings at 8:35 a.m., parents/guardians are asked say good bye to their children and leave the yard.

IN THE BUILDING

Any visiting adult in the building is required to sign in at the office and wear a visitor's nametag.

We are asking our families that they do not go to the classrooms or walk through the halls.

Letting parents walk through our school during school hours creates a culture where students become accustomed to adult "strangers" moving through the halls.

Our office staff is very welcoming and accommodating. During school hours, if you need to see your child or drop off an item, these kinds of requests can be easily fulfilled.

New Security System

This summer, Trillium Lakelands District School Board has installed security systems in many of the schools across the district including Lady Eaton. The camera and door entry buzzer has been installed but is not up and fully functioning. This change will mean that the exterior doors of the school will be locked and all visitors wanting to enter the building during school hours must buzz the front office, identify themselves and then office staff will buzz them in.

Allergy Safe School

Trillium Lakelands DSB recognizes that anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction that can be fatal and that many of our students and staff suffer from extreme life-threatening allergies to certain foods, medications, insect stings, or non-food materials such as latex.

The Board, in partnership with student families and staff members, is committed to ensuring the safety of students and staff who suffer from extreme allergies by empowering school administrators to respond to their needs consistently through information and awareness, in-service, training, providing a safe environment, and the development of emergency medical plans for allergic occurrences.

Each school has the duty to provide a safe environment for all students including individuals with life-threatening allergies. *It is not possible to **reduce the risk of allergy exposure to zero.***

Staff are not able to easily identify or visually distinguish whether the spread a student has in their lunch is real nut butter or an imitation, due to the similar colour and consistency it has to peanut butter.

In order to most effectively reduce the element of risk to students with allergies, and to continue to try to create an allergen-safe environment, **we are asking that schools do not promote the use of imitation peanut/nut spreads and request that students who are bringing imitation and alternative peanut/nut spreads to school choose different lunch alternatives.**

At Lady Eaton we have students with peanut allergies. **PLEASE DO NOT SEND PRODUCTS CONTAINING PEANUTS, TREE NUTS or SUBSTITUTE PEANUT/TREE NUT PRODUCTS (i.e. WOW Butter).** There are many products available for purchase that are labeled peanut safe.

Volunteers

Lady Eaton is looking for reliable adult volunteers to help around the school to assist in the library, help with our snack program, assist during special events, join school council and help in classrooms. If you are interested in filling any of these roles please contact your child's teacher or the school office. Volunteers must complete a criminal background check.

Criminal Reference Checks

Please remember that in order to volunteer in any capacity at Lady Eaton including assisting with field trips: you must have a criminal record check completed. This process takes time. To apply for a criminal background check you must first come to the school office and Mrs. Phillips will provide you with a letter to take to the OPP detachment on Angeline St. in Lindsay. Once your application is processed, you must pick up your criminal background check from the OPP and bring it to the school.

Once you have a criminal record check on file at the school, you must complete an offence declaration each subsequent school year. Please note: If an offence declaration is not completed each year, this is considered a break in service and you must re-apply for a criminal background check. Forms are available at the office. Thank you for your continued cooperation.

Agendas

All students will be provided with a school agenda. The subsidized price is \$5.00 per agenda. Parent/guardians should be signing the agenda each night. This is our primary form of communication between home and school and is a valuable tool in helping improve our students' organizational skills.

School Council News

The first meeting of our parent council will take place in the library on **Thursday, September 25th at 6:30 p.m.** At this meeting we will vote in our 2014-2015 council. New members are always welcome.

Book Fair

Lady Eaton will be hosting a Book Fair from September 11th through to September 18th. The Book Fair will be open the night of Meet the Teacher Thursday, September 11th.

Terry Fox Run

Lady Eaton's annual Terry Fox run will take place on Wednesday, September 23rd. The rain date will be the following day. More information about this event will be sent home closer to the date.

Students in the primary grades are expected to run 1 KM of forested trails at the county meet early October (exact date to follow).
