## Lindsay Rugby Football Club Spring 2016

### **Youth Rugby Programs**

In order to introduce children to the game in a safe, healthy and enjoyable way modifications have been made to the traditional game to suit the developmental stages of children. All coaches have or will be trained and certified as mandated by the Canadian Rugby Union in order to provide a safe and enjoyable experience. The following descriptions should help to demonstrate the connection with these developmental stages.

### **Girls & Boys Under 10's (Gr.3&4, 9 or 10 as of as of Jan. 1, 2016) & Under 8's (Gr.1&2 (6,7,8 as of Jan. 1, 2016).**

Flag rugby is a program to introduce players to the essential skills of passing, catching, running and team play which are necessary to be successful at any level of play and sport. A player is stopped when their flag is taken. Play resumes with a pass from the stopped player to his/her team mates—there are no scrums. After five stops the ball is turned over to the opposing team.

In **May** the Rugby Club will have a **Recreational Flag Rugby** program open to girls and boys ages 6 -14. The sessions will be held on **Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5:30 – 6:30**. Registration in the "**May Program**" provides insurance coverage and membership in the Canadian Rugby Union. This format will allow children, new to the game to, "try it out at a reasonable cost as well as providing returning players time to improve on skills and have some fun At the **end of the four week session** players and parents can decide to continue with the traditional program through the summer or stop at that point. There is an additional cost to continue in the traditional (Club Level) May – Sept. schedule. Participation in tournaments is optional for players and their families. Playing time at tournaments is guaranteed as the Club can enter several teams.

Sessions will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5:30 to 6:30. The schedule in the past has run from May to Sept. with teams entered in tournaments with other Rugby Clubs.
