5. Ontario Health Card number (optional).

It is never too late to register but it is important to **register early** as it affects our staffing.

- 5lbs potatoes

- 1 bunch green onions
- 1 bunch carrots
- 4 bananas
- 1 lb green beans
- 1 cucumber
- 1 pkg mushrooms
- lettuce

By participating, you will be supporting local farmers and businesses, enjoy healthy fruits and vegetables, and save up to 30% on your food bill!

Orders are due at the school the first Tuesday of each month. Good Food Boxes will be delivered to the school the third Tuesday of each month.
