DOWNTOWN FOR LUNCH

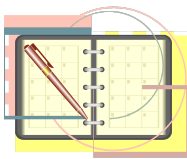

LOST AND FOUND

BUS SAFETY AND INFORMATION

Please familiarize yourself with the route number.



Families are asked to remind their children to be at their stop 5 minutes before the scheduled time and remain standing safely at the shoulder of the road until the bus comes to a complete stop before boarding the bus. To further ensure a safe ride to and from school, students are reminded to remain seated until the bus comes to a complete stop and students **must not eat or drink** on school buses.

Simply click on the "Delays and Cancellations" button and subscribe. Cancellations will still be announced by the local radio station partners.

CREATING AN ALLERGEN-SAFE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

Each school has the duty to provide a safe environment for individuals with life-threatening allergies. **It is not possible to reduce the risk to zero**. The risk of accidental exposure to an allergen can be significantly reduced, although it can never be completely removed. Through careful planning, we can minimize an individual's exposure to triggering allergens, limit the need to use emergency measures, and avoid trauma to all involved parties.

Please refrain from sending any whole nuts, peanut products, products with tree nuts and imitation peanut products.

Your child's classroom teacher may request your assistance in trying to accommodate the needs of all the students in the class.

We appreciate your diligence and support in keeping our students safe.



SCHOOL COUNCIL

Woodville is very fortunate to traditionally have an active and involved Parent Advisory Council. Being involved in School Council can be an enriching and important way to contribute to your school community. The Parent Advisory Council is an advisory body comprised of up to ten parents/guardians, two community representatives, the principal, one teacher representative and one support staff representative.

Provincial regulations require elections for the new Council take place during the first 30 days of the school year. We urge all parents/guardians to consider running for this year's School Council. **If you would like to declare your candidacy, you can obtain a "Candidate Declaration" form from the office. Please return it to the school office no later than 4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 15th.** If there are 10 or fewer parent/guardian declaration forms received, all candidates will be acclaimed at 4:30 p.m. September 15th. If more than 10 declaration forms are submitted, a process will be put in place to conduct a campaign, share candidate profiles and hold an election on Wednesday, September 27th.

School Council meetings are open to the public and held in the library from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. If you are interested in more information about the School Council please contact the school. The first meeting of the new School Council will take place on **Wednesday, Sept 27th. All are welcome.**
