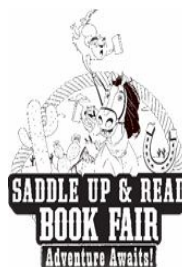
FUNDRAISING

family to the Fair, you'll have the chance to win FREE BOOKS! Adventure Awaits at the Book Fair!



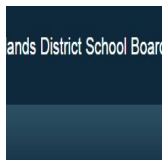
Drive Away Hunger
